Disco Thursday 15th July




As part of our celebrations for what has been on time a stressful year we have arranged an end of year disco for the children. Children will remain in their bubbles with their teachers and the disco










A charcoal sketch by Maisie Y5 in the style of the Aberdare artist Nicholas Evans.
