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Guidance from WG/RCT

Everyone who has classic coronavirus symptoms or who tests positive will continue to be required to self-isolate - no matter how old they are or whether they have been vaccinated or not.

Staff and learners should not attend school if they have any of the classic COVID-19 symptoms (i.e. a new continuous cough, or a high temperature or loss of or change to their sense of taste or smell). Staff and learners who test positive for COVID-19 must not attend school.

Staff and learners displaying wider symptoms (such as fatigue, muscle ache or pain, a sore throat, a headache, a runny nose, nausea, vomiting or diarrhoea) are advised to have a PCR test.

Children and adults with diarrhoea and/or vomiting should remain away from their school or setting until they are symptom free for 48 hours even if their COVID-19 test is negative.

For children displaying wider symptoms parents/carers can book a PCR test online by selecting the 'book a test if advised by a Public Health adviser' option.

Parents/carers can also ring 01443 443151 to book a PCR test if their child has wider symptoms.


