

#### REMEMBRANCE DAY

The children had lots of different experiences in school to commemorate Remembrance Day and I had a lovely time looking and talking about their experiences with them.

Even our youngest children were amazing recognising the 1 minute's silence as they watched a short film on CBeebies commemorating Remembrance Day. Class one have made poppies out of Lego and crafts of different materials (please take a look at Seesaw).

This is a finger painting of the poppies in the fields of Flanders by Avah May.

Class 2 used IT to empathise with life as a fighter pilot. They were able to superimpose a photo of themselves complete with sheepskin jacket and goggles. These are some of their comments:

"I was scared and it was windy and bumpy and scary".

"It was very hot because I had a big coat on and goggles".

"It is scary because it is noisy from the gun shot. I feel nervous".

"Somebody shot my jet down but lucky we survived".

"I was proud but it was frightening and the bombs were loud ".


Here is an acrostic poem from Evie Y3


Poppies grow everywhere to remember the soldiers

#### Holidays in term time
