This week has been **Outdoor Learning Week**. It has been amazing seeing all of our pupils being out and about our school grounds.

**Nursery**: have been exploring 'Rosie's Walk'. **Class 1**: have been re-enacting The Enormous Turnip with ropes. The children have been practising their phonics outside, planted sunflower seeds and counted using natural materials like pine cones and leaves.

**Class 2**: have been making, printing and measuring dinosaur feet. They have visited our local park and designed an Easter Egg with materials from our environment.

**Class 3**: have practised numeracy by measuring trees; they have created an iMovie in Welsh around our school grounds and have written poetry. They went on an insect hunt in our school field.

Some of you would have seen our new outdoor canopy in the back playground. It is to enable our children to be able to learn outdoors in all weather!! The children and staff have already used it even though we are awaiting outdoor furniture.
