### We have received this guidance from Public Health Wales

Re: Increase in scarlet fever and invasive streptococcal disease in 2022 We are writing to inform you of a recent increase in notifications of scarlet fever and invasive streptococcal disease.

# Signs and symptoms of scarlet fever

Scarlet fever, sometimes called scarlatina, is an infectious disease caused by group A streptococcus (GAS) bacteria (also known as Streptococcus pyogenes).

It is highly infectious and can be caught through direct contact with an infected person or through the air via droplets from coughs or sneezes. The characteristic symptom of scarlet fever is a widespread, fine pink-red rash that feels like sandpaper to touch. Other symptoms include a high temperature, a flushed face and a red, swollen tongue. Treatment is straightforward and usually involves a course of penicillin antibiotics.

There has been an increase in severe disease caused by this bacterium (invasive group A streptococcal infections) in late 2022, including some fatal cases in children. Invasive disease may occur without a person having had scarlet fever or sore throat first. Early signs of invasive disease include: high fever, severe muscle aches, local muscle tenderness, or redness at the site of a wound.

If there are any concerns about invasive disease, then urgent medical advice must be sought.

#### Recommended actions

- Staff should be aware of the possibility of this infection in children who become ill with a fever, sore throat or rash
- Parents of unwell children should be advised to seek medical advice for diagnosis and treatment
- Good hand hygiene and avoidance of spread of respiratory secretions (as per influenza- "catch it, bin it, kill it") can help to prevent the spread of infection

#### **RE: Christmas Card Challenge**


We would like to take part in RCT's Christmas Card recycling challenge.

Everyone looked very Christmassy in their jumpers today and a big THANK YOU to the kitchen staff for a lovely Christmas lunch.






# **Pantomime**
